## Diocese of St Edmundsbury & Ipswich

- 478 churches
- 458 listed
- 229 listed grade I (50%)
- 14 churches on the Heritage at Risk Register (3%)



### Diocese of St Edmundsbury & Ipswich

#### Diocese

- 659,000 population
- 53% rural population
- 1379 people per church building

#### National average

- 17% rural population
- 3428 people per church building



The Taylor Review: Sustainability of English Churches and Cathedrals "We need to create a cultural shift in attitudes towards church buildings such that communities realise they are resources that they can use and congregations have the confidence to share space."



## **Key Points**

- National network of Community Support Advisers
- Network of Fabric Support Officers
- Removal of legal barriers and clarification of local authority funding rules
- Future funding model
  - A minor repairs fund
  - A major repairs fund
  - Funding for CSAs and FSOs
- Pilots (18 months)
  - Greater Manchester
  - Suffolk



#### The Pilot

- County of Suffolk (not diocese of St Edmundsbury & Ipswich)
- Listed places of worship of all denominations and faiths 533
- £250,000 pot for urgent minor repairs per financial year
- Maximum grant of £10,000 per church for a project costing no more than £12,000 (inc VAT)
- What it doesn't do:
  - Remove churches from the Heritage at Risk Register
  - Prevent churches from going on the Heritage at Risk Register



## The Suffolk team

Laura Emmins (Community Development Adviser)

Tom Kupper (Fabric Support Officer)



### How does it work?

- Employed and managed by Historic England
- Based at the Diocesan Office
- Manager for both teams in post from mid-October
- Working with data resources supplied by DAC



## What's the priority?

- Money
- Grants for minor urgent repairs totally £250,000 per financial year
- Maximum grant £10,000
- Visiting churches (over 80 expressions of interest)
- Signposting additional help
- Workshops for PCCs run by Churches Conservation Trust



# Is it working?

- Much interest generated within parishes
- Press coverage
- Enquiries from different denominations
- Time management
- Liaison
